Commissioners and Officer Jay A. Stultz:

Under and by virtue of the authority vested in me by Title 5, Subtitle A, Chapter 143 of the Local Government Code, V.T.C.S., said chapter entitled "Municipal Civil Service", I do hereby suspend Officer Jay A. Stultz from paid duty with the San Antonio Police Department for a period of one calendar day, commencing on September 17, 2015, and ending on September 17, 2015.

Officer Stultz has violated Subsection C of Rule XIII of the City of San Antonio Fire Fighters' and Police Officers' Civil Service Commission Rules, said rules having been adopted on February 23, 1998, and thereafter from time to time amended, by the Fire Fighters' and Police Officers' Civil Service Commission as the Civil Service Rules for the Fire and Police Departments of the City of San Antonio. The particular civil service rule violated by Officer Stultz and ground for suspension is as follows:

(12) Violation of an applicable fire or police department rule or special order.

The Rules and Regulations of the San Antonio Police Department which Officer Stultz has violated are as follows:

RULE 3.18 - CITY EQUIPMENT/PROPERTY (A) IMPROPER OR NEGLIGENT HANDLING: Improper or negligent handling of any city property or willful damage to city property is prohibited.

The factual basis for the instant disciplinary suspension is as follows:

On or about May 13, 2015, at approximately 8:30 a.m., while on duty and operating a city-owned vehicle in the 100 block of Interpark Boulevard, Officer Jay A. Stultz negligently struck a metal pole.
