AGREED SUSPENSION

Commissioners and Officer Harold W. Thomaston, Jr.:

WHEREAS, Officer Harold W. Thomaston, Jr., pursuant to Article XXVIII, Section 2 of the Collective Bargaining Agreement by and between the City of San Antonio and the San Antonio Police Officers' Association, was served on January 11, 2016, with a contemplated indefinite suspension; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to said contract, Officer Thomaston was given an opportunity to rebut those charges being brought against him to Police Chief William P. McManus; and

WHEREAS, said opportunity was exercised by Officer Thomaston; and

WHEREAS, Officer Thomaston and Chief McManus have agreed to reduce the discipline in this matter to a twenty-five-day suspension without pay; NOW THEREFORE:

The undersigned parties hereby enter into this suspension agreement wherein it is provided that Officer Thomaston shall be suspended without pay from the San Antonio Police Department for a period of twenty-five days, commencing on February 22, 2016, and ending on March 17, 2016. Officer Thomaston waives any rights to appeal this Agreed Suspension and agrees no administrative or judicial body shall have power to review this Agreed Suspension or alter the terms of this agreement.

Officer Thomaston has violated Subsection C of Rule XIII of the City of San Antonio Fire Fighters' and Police Officers' Civil Service Commission Rules, said rules having been adopted on February 23, 1998, and thereafter from time to time amended, by the Fire Fighters' and Police Officers' Civil Service Commission as the Civil Service Rules for the Fire and Police Departments of the City of San Antonio. The particular civil service rules violated by Officer Thomaston and grounds for suspension are as follows:

(12) Violation of an applicable fire or police department rule or special order.

The Rules and Regulations and Procedures of the San Antonio Police Department which Officer Thomaston has violated are as follows:

RULE 3.36 - SEXUAL MISCONDUCT PROHIBITED (A) Members (sworn and civilian) are prohibited from engaging in sexual conduct while: (1) On-duty; (2) In uniform; (3) Working off-duty (extension of police services); (4) Officially representing the San Antonio Police Department; (5) In a mentoring capacity

(Including, but is not limited to: direct supervision, F.T.O., Academy Instructor or Explorer Advisor, etc.); or (6) Using their position with the San Antonio Police Department in any capacity; (B) Sexual Conduct is defined in accordance with Texas Penal Code Section 21.01 (1) (2) (3), 21.07 (a) (1) (2) (3) (4) and 21.08 (a).

RULE 4.06 - ON-DUTY ACTIVITIES: Members shall not devote any of their on-duty time to any activity other than that which relates to their duty assignment. Members shall not enter places of amusement while on-duty, except for police purposes. Members shall not remain at any one place longer than is necessary to accomplish a police objective.

The factual basis for the instant disciplinary suspension is as follows:

first learned of an alleged criminal violation by one of its officers. On or about October 03, 2015, Officer Harold W. Thomaston, Jr. agreed to meet a woman he knew, intersection of Bandera Road and Poss Road. Officer Thomastononline through a social website called had met "Match.com." When Officer Thomaston told meet him in the area of Bandera Road and Poss Road, he informed her he would be in full uniform and inside a marked patrol vehicle. then met Officer Thomaston in the parking lot of a strip mall, which was actually located at Poss Road and Criss subsequently Cross Drive, in Leon Valley, Texas. provided a statement to Detective Duane Vargas of SAPD's Special Victims Unit and alleged that Officer Thomaston exposed himself to her inside his patrol car while he was in full SAPD uniform. She also stated Officer Thomaston touched her breast and legs without her consent. The criminal investigation of this incident was handled by the SAPD Special Victims Unit and has since been forwarded to Leon Valley Police Department due to the jurisdiction of the offense.

The administrative investigation of this incident shows that Officer Thomaston was on duty when he met with The AVL (GPS) in his assigned patrol vehicle confirms Officer Thomaston was in Leon Valley at the agreed meeting place from 7:18 p.m. to 7:48 p.m., establishing that Officer Thomaston devoted his on-duty time to non police activity.

On October 26, 2015, Officer Thomaston wrote a detailed account of the events that took place between he and provided it to Detective Cuevas. In his statement, Officer Thomaston admits to touching leg.
