AGREED SUSPENSION

Commissioners and Officer Paul E. Zavala:

WHEREAS, Officer Paul E. Zavala, pursuant to Article XXVIII, Section 2 of the Collective Bargaining Agreement by and between the City of San Antonio and the San Antonio Police Officers' Association, was served on September 3, 2015, with a three-day contemplated suspension; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to said contract, Officer Zavala was given an opportunity to rebut those charges being brought against him to Police Chief Anthony L. Treviño, Jr.; and

WHEREAS, said opportunity was exercised by Officer Zavala; and

WHEREAS, Officer Zavala and his captain, Vidal Resendez, have agreed and Chief Treviño has approved of settling this matter with a three-day suspension without pay; NOW THEREFORE:

The undersigned parties hereby enter into this suspension agreement wherein it is provided that Officer Zavala shall be suspended without pay from the San Antonio Police Department for a period of three days, commencing on October 6, 2015, and ending on October 8, 2015. Officer Zavala waives any rights to appeal this Agreed Suspension and agrees no administrative or judicial body shall have power to review this Agreed Suspension or alter the terms of this agreement.

Officer Zavala has violated Subsection C of Rule XIII of the City of San Antonio Fire Fighters' and Police Officers' Civil Service Commission Rules, said rules having been adopted on February 23, 1998, and thereafter from time to time amended, by the Fire Fighters' and Police Officers' Civil Service Commission as the Civil Service Rules for the Fire and Police Departments of the City of San Antonio. The particular civil service rules violated by Officer Zavala and grounds for suspension are as follows:

(12) Violation of an applicable fire or police department rule or special order.

The Rules and Regulations and Procedures of the San Antonio Police Department which Officer Zavala has violated are as follows:

RULE 4.12 - OFFICIAL REPORTS: (A) COMPLETION OF REPORTS: Members shall complete reports promptly, accurately, and in conformance with the reporting procedures of the department. (B) SUBMISSION OF REPORTS: Members shall complete and submit all reports prior to going off-duty.

PROCEDURE 707 – CRASH INVESTIGATION (.04) RESPONDING TO CRASHES (A) Responsibilities of first officer arriving at a crash scene: (5) Identify all drivers or pedestrians involved in the crash and check for valid driver's license and proof of insurance. This includes checking each person for active warrants and taking appropriate action if warrants are found.

The factual basis for the instant disciplinary suspension is as follows:

On or about May 6, 2015, Officer Paul E. Zavala was dispatched to an accident at Felan and S. San Marcos at 11:15 a.m. Upon arriving, Officer Zavala was advised by the complainant that a white van had just crashed into his fence and fled down the street. Officer Zavala located the driver and the van, which was parked just down the street. The van had considerable front-end damage, which resulted in the air bags being deployed. The van was not driveable at that point. Officer Zavala identified the driver and in doing so, found the driver to have a suspended driver's license and outstanding traffic warrants for his arrest. Not only did Officer Zavala not take any action regarding the suspended driver's license or the outstanding warrants, he did not write or submit a crash report as required.

A copy of the instant disciplinary suspension order is being filed with the Fire Fighters' and Police Officers' Civil Service Commission
