Commissioners and Officer Eduardo San Miguel:

Under and by virtue of the authority vested in me by Title 5, Subtitle A, Chapter 143 of the Local Government Code, V.T.C.S., said chapter entitled "Municipal Civil Service", I do hereby suspend Officer Eduardo San Miguel from paid duty with the San Antonio Police Department for a period of one calendar day, commencing on February 20, 2017, and ending on February 20, 2017.

Officer San Miguel has violated Subsection C of Rule XIII of the City of San Antonio Fire Fighters' and Police Officers' Civil Service Commission Rules, said rules having been adopted on February 23, 1998, and thereafter from time to time amended, by the Fire Fighters' and Police Officers' Civil Service Commission as the Civil Service Rules for the Fire and Police Departments of the City of San Antonio. The particular civil service rule violated by Officer San Miguel and ground for suspension is as follows:

- (12) Violation of an applicable fire or police department rule or special order.

The Rules and Regulations of the San Antonio Police Department which Officer San Miguel has violated are as follows:

RULE 3.18 - CITY EQUIPMENT/PROPERTY (A) IMPROPER OR NEGLIGENT HANDLING: Improper or negligent handling of any city property or willful damage to city property is prohibited.


The factual basis for the instant disciplinary suspension is as follows:

On or about November 28, 2016, at approximately 11:03 a.m., while on duty and operating a city-owned vehicle in the 2400 block of N. Loop 1604 E., Officer Eduardo San Miguel negligently struck a vehicle.

The level of this suspension is based upon Officer San Miguel's cumulative point total for this accident and other chargeable accidents within the twenty-four month period prior to this accident as per Procedure 303.17 of the San Antonio Police Department General Manual.


A copy of the instant disciplinary suspension order is being filed with the Fire Fighters' and Police Officers' Civil Service Commission.


