AGREED SUSPENSION

Commissioners and Officer Jeremy E. Palmer:

WHEREAS, Officer Jeremy E. Palmer, pursuant to Article XXVIII, Section 2 of the Collective Bargaining Agreement by and between the City of San Antonio and the San Antonio Police Officers' Association, was served on January 14, 2017, with a three-day contemplated suspension; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to said contract, Officer Palmer was given an opportunity to rebut those charges being brought against him to Police Chief William P. McManus; and

WHEREAS, said opportunity was exercised by Officer Palmer; and

WHEREAS, Officer Palmer and Chief McManus have agreed that the discipline in this matter shall be a three-day suspension without pay; **NOW THEREFORE**:

The undersigned parties hereby enter into this suspension agreement wherein it is provided that Officer Palmer shall be suspended without pay from the San Antonio Police Department for a period of three days, commencing on February 25, 2017, and ending on February 27, 2017. Should Officer Palmer not be involved in a chargeable traffic accident in the year following the issuance of this agreed suspension, upon application by Officer Palmer within two weeks of such date, and approval by the Chief of Police, three days' pay and benefits will be returned to Officer Palmer. Officer Palmer waives any rights to appeal this Agreed Suspension and agrees no administrative or judicial body shall have power to review this Agreed Suspension or alter the terms of this agreement.

Officer Palmer has violated Subsection C of Rule XIII of the City of San Antonio Fire Fighters' and Police Officers' Civil Service Commission Rules, said rules having been adopted on February 23, 1998, and thereafter from time to time amended, by the Fire Fighters' and Police Officers' Civil Service Commission as the Civil Service Rules for the Fire and Police Departments of the City of San Antonio. The particular civil service rules violated by Officer Palmer and grounds for suspension are as follows:

- (12) Violation of an applicable fire or police department rule or special order.

The Rules and Regulations and Procedures of the San Antonio Police Department which Officer Palmer has violated are as follows:

RULE 3.18 - CITY EQUIPMENT/PROPERTY (A) IMPROPER OR NEGLIGENT HANDLING: Improper or negligent handling of any city property or willful damage to city property is prohibited.

The factual basis for the instant disciplinary suspension is as follows:

On or about October 11, 2016, at approximately 2:45 a.m., while on duty and operating a city-owned vehicle at the intersection of Fredericksburg Road and Huebner Road, Officer Jeremy E. Palmer negligently collided with a vehicle.

The level of this suspension is based upon Officer Palmer's cumulative point total for this accident and other chargeable accidents within the twenty-four month period prior to this accident as per Procedure 303.17 of the San Antonio Police Department General Manual.

A copy of the instant disciplinary suspension order is being filed with the Fire Fighters' and Police Officers' Civil Service Commission.

I also acknowledge that I have been informed that my right to appeal the decision of a hearing examiner/arbitrator to district court pursuant to section 143.057 of the Texas Local Government Code may have been modified by the provisions of article 28 of the current Collective Bargaining Agreement by and between the City of San Antonio and the San Antonio Police Officers' Association. I further acknowledge that in light of my entry into this Agreed

Suspension, I shall have no right to appeal said suspension nor will any administrative or judicial body have power to review same or alter its terms. I do hereby waive any and all rights to appeal said suspension and no administrative or judicial body shall have power to review same or alter its terms.
