I skipped a few seconds here and there on the video but I didn't hear the defendant make the admission that was hand written at the end of the police report.

- 1:23 Martin contacts male driver who has warrants, detains him and puts him in patrol car.
- 6:50 passenger tells Martin the car belongs to her
- 9:15 Martin begins search of car, unclear where he finds marijuana but appears to be either in center or passenger side of car. Does not match with what is in report.
- 11:35 Martin states he doesn't think his COBAN is working.
- 13:25 Martin tells passenger he believes driver put the weed in the car because he won't answer any questions about what is in car.
- 13:55 Martin tells passenger he is going to call female officer to search her, and she says "I won't waste your time anymore" and says she has weed in her bra. Martin turns his mic volume down and asks how much is it and where she got it. She says she just bought it from someone nearby.
- 15:35 Martin mutes mic and has inaudible conversation with other officer
- 16:00 Martin (to passenger): "This is what I'm going to do. I'm going to take the cuffs off. Take it out, ok? And you're going to put it on the seat. We're gonna collect it all." (She says something inaudible but sounds like she is feeling bad about the situation) Martin says, "He's gotta go down, ok?
- 16:42 unmutes mic, walks her to car door and says "Take it out and put it on the seat." Says they usually don't arrest for weed but they have to because they're being recorded. Then says "so, we're going to say we found it all in the same spot, and that's that."
- 17:49 Martin reaches into passenger compartment where passenger placed the weed
- 1819:47 Martin asks passenger if it was just the three bags, and she says yes.
- 20:50 Martin collects evidence from car
- 21:18 Martin asks passenger "what's the difference in these weeds?" Holding the bags and showing her. She tells him.
- 25:58 meanwhile in the patrol car, other officer laughs and tells defendant "they're going to legalize marijuana one day and I hope they do."
- 26:05 Martin says to passenger, "Shit, back in the day, I went to jail all the time." Passenger says "but you're a cop, how does that work?" He says he got arrested for racing.
- 27:05 passenger laughs and says "can you just take it all out and put it together so it won't look bad all in separate baggies?" Martin says something inaudible but says they are just going to go by the weight.
- 29:50 Martin says to passenger "chances are, especially with the new DA, they're trying to get rid of all these old cases, they'll probably just throw it out. I wouldn't worry about it."
- 48:35 other officer says he will go weigh weed and put the number in. Martin says "you think it'll be less than 2 right?" Other officer says "yeah."
- 49:23 Martin tells defendant, "if I ever run into you again and I'm by myself, rest easy man cause you know I ain't gonna do shit about it."
- 49:30 Martin says to other officer, "hey man can you get the COBAN? I don't want that shit to be —" and video cuts off.

Officer Martin was interviewed at the SARIC office. The interview was DVD recorded. Officer Martin was given a non custodial admonishment by Det. Ortiz at the beginning of the interview. Officer Martin said he initiated a traffic stop for an expired registration and arrested the male driver for warrants. Officer Martin said he searched the vehicle and found baggies of marijuana between the center console and the driver's seat. Officer Martin said the driver admitted the marijuana was his. Officer Martin was vague and could not recall the exact circumstances in dealing with the female passenger. After confronted with the fact of what is seen in the COBAN video is different with what is written in his report, Officer Martin acknowledges the female passenger had marijuana on her person and claims she told him the male driver concealed the marijuana in the car and told her "they're not going to search you" insinuating she hide the marijuana on her person. According to the details of the complaint, a review of Officer Matthew Martin #1140 and Officer Frederick Grataski's #0766 COBAN video documenting the traffic stop and arrest of Juan Martinez appears to show the officers made the decision to arrest Juan Martinez for possession of Marijuana that was in fact in the possession of the female passenger. "The police report appears to have been falsified to support the arrest". Within the folder I also found an email (Casey Reynolds to Jim Wheat) with what appears to be a brief summary with times of the COBAN video of the traffic stop and arrest of Martinez.

A decision was made to speak to Officer Martin and Grataski first since they had been placed on Administrative duty and there was the potential for them to discuss the incident prior to being interviewed. I began reviewing the COBAN video.

(Note: I used the VLC media player to playback the COBAN DVD Disc. The first video is from the front facing camera. When the first video is complete, a second video of the prisoner back seat area begins. Also note the VLC playing time for both videos is not synchronized.

Det. Ortiz called and spoke to Officer Martin over the phone. Officer Martin agreed to come to the PSHQ building and speak to Det. Ortiz. The following is a brief interview overview and is not considered direct quotes or a transcript. (For complete details see the DVD recording of the interview in the case file.)

- Officer Martin was working Directive Patrol with Officer Fred Grataski on the East side. He stopped a vehicle for an expired registration tag. The Hispanic male driver had warrants so he arrested the driver. After the arrest, he searched and found baggies of marijuana between the center console and the driver's seat. Officer Martin said the driver admitted the marijuana was his.
- After further discussion of what was on the Coban video and how it was different from what was on the report, Officer Martin said the female had a bag of weed on her. According to Officer Martin, the female told him that the driver saw police behind them and that the driver "started stuffing it" and then the driver told her "they're not gonna search you" insinuating the passenger hide the marijuana on her person.
- Officer Martin said he told the female passenger to remove the marijuana from her person and place it on the passenger seat. Officer Martin said he put the marijuana the female passenger had with the male's marijuana because he was using his discretion because the male "took ownership of it."
- Officer Martin terminated the interview.

I completed a review of the DVD COBAN videos. The following is a brief summary of the videos and is not to be considered direct quotes or a transcript. As noted earlier, I used the VLC player to playback the videos. The first video is from the forward facing camera view and the total VLC playtime is 49:37. When making reference to this view I will use the VLC playing time (Front View – mm:ss). The second video begins shortly after the first video ends. The second video is the back seat view of the marked unit. This video has a VLC playtime length of 49:38 but is not synchronized with the front facing video. The rear view does have a visible date and time stamp but for continuity I will use the VLC playing time (Rear View – mm:ss) when referencing the rear view video. The driver of the suspect vehicle has been identified as Juan Martinez and will be referred to as Juan in the summary. The passenger of the vehicle has been identified as Miriam Aquino and will be referred to as Miriam in the summary.

The video begins with the marked unit driving behind the suspect vehicle. After the light bar is activated the vehicle pulls into a parking lot. Officer Martin walks up to the driver's side door and speaks with Juan while Officer Grataski walks to the passenger side of the vehicle. The officers return to their vehicle and run a person check on the individuals. Officer Martin tells Officer Grataski the passenger is clear and the driver has warrants. Officer Martin asks Juan to step out of the vehicle and proceeds to handcuff him and tells him he is being detained at the moment. Officer Martin informs Juan he has outstanding traffic warrants. Officer Martin pats down Juan and asked him if there are any drugs in the car. Juan does not answer the officer.

(Front View – 07:20) / (Rear View – 06:31) Officer Martin places Juan in the back of the police vehicle and then walks over to the suspect vehicle and begins to speak to Miriam. Officer Martin asks Miriam if there are narcotics or weapons in the vehicle. Miriam replies "I hope not because this is my only transportation". Officer Martin tells Miriam "we can work around that if that's the case". Officer Martin asks Miriam if "there is anything on you" (referring to narcotics or weapons) to which she replies she does not. Miriam tells the officers she does not know where she is at and says she just wants to get home and take her kids to school tomorrow.

not aware. Officer Martin tells Miriam he believes Juan hid the marijuana because he would not answer his question about whether there were narcotics in the vehicle.

(Front View – 12:55) / (Rear View 12:30 Audio) Officer Martin handcuffs Miriam and tells her she is being detained and is going to request a female officer come out to the scene and search her. After Officer Martin asked her again if she had anything on her, Miriam says "it is right here". The location she is referring to can't be seen on camera. Miriam says she does not want to waste anyone's time and offers to remove it after Officer Martin tells her he has to get a female officer to the scene to search her. Miriam says it is "weed" and says it is a "20". Miriam acknowledges the narcotics were purchased at the apartments nearby. Miriam tells Officer Martin she does not want to go to jail and has kids at home being watched by a family member.

(Front View - 14:28) Officer Martin walks out of camera view and mutes his mic. Officer Martin and Officer Grataski can be heard having a conversation.

(Front View - 14:44)/ (Rear View- 14:12 Audio) At one point of the conversation Officer Martin can be hear saying something with the words "(inaudible)..." take it out" and "(inaudible..take the fall for all of this". Officer Grataski can be heard saying, "Good with me". Officer Martin then says, "(inaudible)..have her get out of here; take the car".

(Front View - 15:00)/ (Rear View - 14:33 Audio) Officer Martin walks back to where Miriam is standing. Officer Martin, while his Mic is still muted, tells Miriam "This is what I'm going to do ok? I'm going to take the cuffs off; take it out, ok? (inaudible) and you're going to put it on the seat; we're going to collect it all". Miriam replies, "Oh my God y'all are the best". Officer Martin tells Miriam Juan is going to be arrested for the found marijuana to which Miriam says she will help Juan get out of jail.

(Front View - 15:30) Officer Martin removes the hand cuffs from Miriam. Officer Martin activates his mic while Miriam walks up to the open passenger door. Officer Martin tells Miriam to face the door and take it (marijuana) out and put it on the seat. Miriam asks if she can speak to Juan.

(Front View – 16:00) / (Rear View - 15:39 Audio) Officer Martin tells Miriam he and Officer Grataski are working narcotics interdiction and because of that are in a vehicle that is recording. Officer Martin tells Miriam, "we're going to say we found it all in the same spot and that's that".

(Front View – 16:18)/ (Rear View 15:50 Audio) Officer Martin Mutes his mic and tells Miriam, "You need to be careful about that". Officer Martin has a brief conversation that is inaudible and at one point mentions "..you have kids to think about".

(Front View - 16:44) Officer Martin reactivates his mic as he is walking to the passenger side of the suspect vehicle. Officer Martin reaches into the passenger side of the suspect vehicle and collects the evidence. Officer Martin allows Miriam to walk to the passenger side of the police car and speak to Juan.

(Front View - 17:00) Miriam walks out of view towards the passenger side of the patrol car.

(Rear View – 16:48) Miriam tells Juan, "they are going to take you in; call my phone". Miriam proceeds to give Juan her number. Miriam also tells Juan she is going to work on his bond.

(Front View – 17:45) / (Rear View – 17:14) Officer Martin tells Juan he and Officer Grataski are in a "camera car" working interdiction. Officer Martin tells Juan they are letting Miriam "slide" even though she had narcotics on her but have to "take" him. Officer Martin tells Juan he is not being charged with distribution. Officer Martin tells Juan they are going to let Miriam "slide" and take the car. Officer Martin explains he is trying to work with them (Juan and Miriam) as much as he can. Officer Martin exits the vehicle.

(Rear View – 18:10) After Juan asks Officer Grataski if he is being charged for possession, Officer Grataski confirms he is.

(Front View - 17:49) Miriam walks back to the rear of her vehicle.

(Front View – 18:43)/ (Rear View 18:20) Officer Martin walks back into camera view and asks Miriam if it was only 3 bags. Miriam confirms it was only 3 bags. Officer Martin looks through the vehicle again and then returns to the police vehicle empty handed and asks Juan if he wants his wallet, phone and money that is in the vehicle. Officer Martin gets the items from the vehicle. Miriam is using her cell phone and asks Officer Martin questions regarding the length of time Juan will be in Jail and about her keys. Officer Grataski can be heard speaking with Juan and asking him about the quality of marijuana he is in possession of.

(Front View - 21:15) The officers start talking about beginning the paperwork for this call.

(Front View – 26:10)/ (Rear View 26:30) Officer Martin is talking with Miriam and telling her about the booking process. Miriam asks Officer Martin if he can put all the marijuana in one bag so "it won't look bad in separate baggies". Officer Martin tells her Juan is not going to jail for distribution and they are using the weight of the marijuana to charge Juan.

(Front View - 30:40) Miriam gets into her vehicle and leaves the parking lot.

(Front View -36:45) The officers start driving from the parking lot to the Magistrates office.

(Front View – 48:00) / (Rear View - 48:20) The officers arrive at the Magistrate's Office rear parking lot. Officer Grataski says he will take Juan into the magistrate's office and put the evidence in the property room while Officer Martin stays in the vehicle and finishes the report. Officer Martin says he will put the weight (marijuana) on the report after Officer Grataski weighs it at the property room. Officer Grataski tells Officer Martin "it should be less than 2" (referring to 2 oz.) which Officer Martin responds "yea".

(Front View – 49:06)/ (Rear View - 48:55) Officer Martin tells Juan he is not writing him citations for the traffic violations. Officer Martin tells Juan he appreciates him "being cool". Juan responds by saying "you're just doing your job. Officer Martin tells Juan "if I ever run into you again and I'm by myself, breathe easy man cause you know I aint going to do shit about It". Juan expresses his appreciation. Officer Grataski asks Officer Martin to turn off the COBAN so it will not start beeping. (mic will give an alert when it is out of range)

#### Key Points of the COBAN Video

After Officer Martin detained Juan for traffic warrants he conducted a search of the vehicle. Although it is not clear where Officer Martin found the narcotics, his position in the vehicle is consistent with finding the narcotics around the center console or the passenger side area and not between the driver's seat and the door as he wrote in his report. Officer Martin expressed his belief Juan hid the marijuana because Juan did not answer the question whether there was narcotics in the vehicle. I did not hear Miriam say the marijuana was Juan's nor did I hear Juan claim ownership of the marijuana found in the vehicle. Officer Martin muted his mic while having a conversation with Officer Grataski. Although the entire conversation is not clear, the words that are heard such as "take the fall for it all" and then instructing Miriam to remove the marijuana from her person and put it in the car leads me to believe the decision was made during that conversation to charge Juan with possession of all the marijuana found in the vehicle knowing it was not all his.

During his interview Officer Martin claimed he used his discretion to release Miriam because Juan had claimed ownership of the Marijuana found. The COBAN does not show Juan claiming ownership of the marijuana nor does it show Officer Martin trying to establish ownership.

During Miriam's interview she said she questioned why Juan was being arrested for all the marijuana in the vehicle if the vehicle was hers and she was in possession of some of the marijuana. The COBAN video shows Miriam did not question the officer and was actually relieved she was not being arrested.

Although Juan did not claim ownership of all the marijuana he also did not object when he discovered Miriam was not going to jail and he was being charged with possession of all of the marijuana.

Det. Ortiz spoke to Mr. Juan Martinez Jr. over the phone. Juan agreed to come to the SARIC office for an interview. The following is a brief overview of the interview and is not considered direct quotes or a transcript of the interview. (For complete details see the DVD recording of the interview in the case file.)

- Juan acknowledged he and his cousin (Mariam) purchased marijuana together at an apartment complex.
- Juan said they purchased 2 bags of marijuana referred to as twenties and a smaller bag of "hydro" marijuana for a total of three bags. Juan said one bag was for him, one was for Miriam and the third was for a friend who was not in the car.
- Juan said Miriam was in possession of the bags while he drove the vehicle.
- Juan said at the time he was pulled over he did not see where Miriam hid the bags of marijuana and claimed he was not in possession of the marijuana and did not conceal marijuana anywhere around him.
- Juan said after he was placed in the back of the marked unit Miriam came to the passenger side window and spoke to him. Miriam said one of the officers told her that Juan said he was going to take the rap for it (referring to marijuana). Juan said he did not have a conversation with the officer and did not claim all the marijuana was his as Miriam claims the officer said.
- Juan said he was under the impression he was being arrested for his traffic warrants and not for the marijuana.
- Juan acknowledged he has seen the COBAN video of the night he was arrested.

**Note:** During the interview Juan claimed the officer told him he was not going to arrest him for the marijuana that was found. A review of the COBAN video (Prisoner Rear View 18:14) indicates Officer Grataski informs Juan he is being arrested for possession of marijuana. At the end of the video the officer informed Mr. Martinez he was not being issued any citations for the traffic violations.

Question No. 5: Did you complete a report regarding the traffic stop and arrest of Mr. Juan Martinez on April 7<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup>, 2015? If no, provide a detailed account of your actions and observations of that incident.

Answer: No. I did not write the offense report, I did however prepare the booking slip and the detention form 17. I also processed the evidence into the SAPD property room. I assisted as cover during the stop and I also assisted with the search of the passenger side of the vehicle and continued to assist when needed. I acted as a cover officer as Officer Martin handled the stop and interacted with the suspects.

Question No. 6: While in the presence of the female (SP) you mute your COBAN microphone at 15:36 – 16:43 and at 17:19 – 17:48 in the video time line as captured. This time corresponds specifically to the times Officer Martin was talking about placing all the marijuana on the male (AP) and charging him for the total amount of marijuana found. Provide a detailed account as to why you choose to mute your microphone at those times.

Answer: For the first time I muted the COBAN, Officer Martin gestured to speak privately away from female passenger, and also pointed to my coban light, I took it as to mute so I did. Other officers have also done this same gesture when wanting to talk. Officers are allowed to and often do mute their COBAN while discussing among themselves police related and non-police related matters. I muted my mic because I believed Officer Martin desired to talk about something that was not necessary to be on COBAN.

As to the second time there really is not any explanation. I was sort of off in my own little world not really paying attention to the conversation between Officer Martin and Ms. Aquino standing a bit of a distance back as they talked. The video might look like I was a bit close but you can see from the video that after Officer Martin stops talking to Ms. Aquino, he actually steps towards the vehicle away from Ms. Aquino and I don't have to move out of his way as I am not close to him.

I knew the COBAN was going to show that Ms. Aquino had narcotics in her possession, my muting the COBAN was in no way going to change that fact and my muting of the COBAN was in no way attempting to hide what was plainview on the video which was that Ms. Aquino had marijuana in her possession at that time. I in fact got on the radio to call over a female officer to search Ms. Aquino for those drugs we suspected on her. I was not trying to cover up the fact that Ms. Aquino had drugs on her.

- Question No. 7: At approximately 15:47 in the COBAN video (VTS 01 1), during the time your Microphone was muted, Officer Martin is heard having a conversation with you and he said, "....take the fall for all of it" to which you respond, "...Good with me" What was the meaning of this conversation?
- Answer: I believe he stated that Mr. Martinez stated it was his marijuana and he would have the female passenger take it out and put it in the seat and Mr. Martinez take the fall for all of it, and my response was reflecting I understood.

It is common for vehicle stops in which narcotics are recovered such as this stop where there are males and females in the vehicle, that males in possession of the drugs will ask or order the females to hide the drugs so that officers (usually male officers) cannot find the narcotics as easily because offenders are aware that male officers are restricted from searching females as easily as males. I believed that the situation in this case was that the narcotics, all of them, belonged to Mr. Martinez and that he has asked or ordered Ms. Aquino to hide them in her bra. I thought that was what Officer Martin was telling me so I was not surprised that we were going to arrest Mr. Martinez for possession of all the drugs. In fact neither Ms. Aquino or Mr. Martinez expressed any disagreement with this at anytime.

- Question No. 8: Did you complete the intake document on the arrest of Juan Martinez on 04-08-2015? That document detailed Mr. Martinez was arrested and booked for possession of Marijuana 0-2oz. - Question No. 10: In your recorded interview with SARIC detectives you state that you heard from Officer Martin and/or from the SP or AP that the marijuana found in the SP's vehicle and on the SP herself belonged to the AP, Mr. Martinez. The COBAN video/Audio that was running the entire time on scene does not confirm that statement. How do you respond?

Answer: I thought it was stated at the scene sometime during the stop, but after watching the COBAN I am still unsure when it was stated, there is a possibility that it occurred in the patrol vehicle after the arrest and booking were complete while going back to the district as we may have reflected on the stop post arrest. This might have been the impression I got from my conversation with Officer Martin at the time I first muted my mic. It is also possible just from the circumstances presented to us when we stopped the vehicle, being one male driver and a female passenager that my mind was already thinking along the lines that the male might attempt to hide any drugs he had on the female as that is a common tactic from my past experience.

In the COBAN video, I can also be heard discussing with Mr. Martinez the nature of the narcotics in each baggie and how they smelled different to me and I asked if to explain to me why that was. Mr. Martinez then gave an explanation as to the different type of marijuana in each bag and that to me tended to confirm that all the baggies were his because why would he know the difference between what was in each bag if they were not all his.

There seemed to be concern that Officer Martin and I were trumping the charges on Mr. Martinez from the SARIC interviews but the amount recovered from Mr. Martinez and then the additional amount from Ms. Aquino did not result in any increase in the charges.

Question No. 15: Do you have any additional pertinent information to add to this investigation?

Answer: I believe the case revolves around the video and what the report reads. I did not know that Officer Martin would not include the female into the narrative of the report, I assumed the report would have included her participation in what happened as she was a witness and at the stop and in fact had the drugs on her. Officer Martin and I never discussed how the report was going to be written, only who was going to do what as far as writing the report, booking slips and process Mr. Martinez into the magistrate and that I would process the evidence into the property room.

I think by past experience in dealing with vehicle stops such as this involving a male and female might have got my mind thinking along the lines that Ms. Aquino might be hiding drugs for Mr. Martinez as that is a common occurrence. So when that information I thought was confirmed to me, I was not surprised to hear Mr. Martinez would be arrested for possession of all the drugs recovered. I did in fact tell Mr. Martinez he was being charged for possession when he asked me and my discussion with him about the drugs to me confirmed that they were all his drugs.

From watching the COBAN video you might get the impression that Officer Martin and I work together often but in fact this was the first and only time we have worked directed patrol together that I can recall. I usually work alone while on patrol. Working directed patrol is a rare thing at the East Substation in my experience. I also don't have a problem performing arrests involving marijuana possession and believe my work history shows I do those arrests.

I honestly think this entire situation was created because of some laziness on the part of Officer Martin and myself. If we both would have been more attentive to the details of this stop it would not have lead to this situation.
