AGREED SUSPENSION

Commissioners and Detective Bernard A. Costa:

WHEREAS, Detective Bernard A. Costa, pursuant to Article XXVIII, Section 2 of the Collective Bargaining Agreement by and between the City of San Antonio and the San Antonio Police Officers' Association, was served on June 4, 2017, with a forty-two-day contemplated suspension; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to said contract, Detective Costa was given an opportunity to rebut those charges being brought against him to Police Chief William P. McManus; and

WHEREAS, said opportunity was exercised by Detective Costa; and

WHEREAS, Detective Costa and Chief McManus have agreed to reduce the discipline in this matter to a twenty-day suspension without pay; NOW THEREFORE:

The undersigned parties hereby enter into this suspension agreement wherein it is provided that Detective Costa shall be suspended without pay from the San Antonio Police Department for a period of twenty days, commencing on July 2, 2017, and ending on July 21, 2017. Upon successful completion of one year, from the date this suspension is signed, without an allegation of similar misconduct which is subsequently sustained, and upon application by Detective Costa within two weeks of such date, and approval by the Chief of Police, ten days' pay and benefits will be returned to Detective Costa. Detective Costa waives any rights to appeal this Agreed Suspension and agrees no administrative or judicial body shall have power to review this Agreed Suspension or alter the terms of this agreement.

Detective Costa has violated Subsection C of Rule XIII of the City of San Antonio Fire Fighters' and Police Officers' Civil Service Commission Rules, said rules having been adopted on February 23, 1998, and thereafter from time to time amended, by the Fire Fighters' and Police Officers' Civil Service Commission as the Civil Service Rules for the Fire and Police Departments of the City of San Antonio. The particular civil service rules violated by Detective Costa and grounds for suspension are as follows:

> Violation of an applicable fire or police department rule or special (12)order.

The Rules and Regulations and Procedures of the San Antonio Police Department which Detective Costa has violated are as follows:

> RULE 4.07 - PROMPT RESPONSE TO ALL CALLS: Officers shall respond without delay to all calls for police service from citizens or other members. Immediately upon completion of the call, officers shall notify the dispatcher of their return to service.

> PROCEDURE 401 - OFFENSE/INCIDENT/SUPPLEMENTAL REPORTS (.04) THE PRELIMINARY INVESTIGATION: The Offense Report is prepared and submitted when the preliminary investigation reveals any of

the following: (A) An offense classified as a Class B misdemeanor of higher ANTONIO (refer to the Texas Penal Code or GM Procedure 708, Follow-Up Units) STURCES DEP

PROCEDURE 410 - BODY WORN CAMERAS (.06) RECORDUNG 2C) AM | 1: 17 Officers shall use the recording to gather pertinent information for composing reports, training, and investigatory purposes.

PROCEDURE 701 - CRIME SCENE DUTIES: (.03) PHYSICAL EVIDENCE (C) Physical evidence must be properly preserved, recorded, and collected for it to be of use in discovering the facts of a crime.

The factual basis for the instant disciplinary suspension is as follows:

On or about January 1, 2017, UEDI Detective Bernard A. Costa was dispatched to a call for an Assault Report, CFS SAPD-2017-0003941, at Metropolitan Hospital at 1310 McCullough.

While responding to the call, UEDI Costa failed to utilize his Body Worn Camera. A search of Body Worn Camera retention revealed footage of calls before and after the Assault Report call.

Further, UEDI Costa failed to take photographs, obtain information, or collect any physical evidence regarding the Assault call to which he was assigned.

Further, UEDI Costa failed to complete an Offense report as prescribed by SAPD procedure. Instead the call was N-Coded by UEDI Costa.

Further, following the call described above, UEDI Costa took a personal telephone call; and UEDI Costa drove to a secluded area, not finishing the above call until more than an hour and a half after arriving at Metropolitan Hospital.

A copy of the instant disciplinary suspension order is being filed with the Fire Fighters' and Police Officers' Civil Service Commission.
