AGREED SUSPENSION

Gentlemen and Probationary Officer Julissa M. Bryant:

WHEREAS, Probationary Officer Julissa M. Bryant, pursuant to Article XXVII, Section 2 of the Collective Bargaining Agreement by and between the City of San Antonio and the San Antonio Police Officers' Association, was served on December 8, 2017, with a one-day contemplated suspension; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to said contract, Probationary Officer Bryant was given an opportunity to rebut those charges being brought against her to Police Chief William P. McManus; and

WHEREAS, said opportunity was exercised by Probationary Officer Bryant; and

WHEREAS, Probationary Officer Bryant and Chief McManus have agreed that the discipline in this matter shall be a one-day suspension held in abeyance for a period of one (1) year; NOW THEREFORE:

The undersigned parties hereby enter into this suspension agreement wherein it is provided that Probationary Officer Bryant shall be suspended without pay from the San Antonio Police Department for a period of one day. The one-day suspension of Probationary Officer Bryant shall be held in abeyance for a period of one year, after which time the suspension will be vacated. Probationary Officer Bryant shall serve the suspension if she is found to have committed any violations of similar misconduct which are subsequently sustained within twelve months of October 23, 2017. Probationary Officer Bryant waives any rights to appeal this Agreed Suspension and agrees no administrative or judicial body shall have power to review this Agreed Suspension or alter the terms of this agreement.

Probationary Officer Bryant has violated Subsection C of Rule XIII of the City of San Antonio Fire Fighters' and Police Officers' Civil Service Commission Rules, said rules having been adopted on February 23, 1998, and thereafter from time to time amended, by the Fire Fighters' and Police Officers' Civil Service Commission as the Civil Service Rules for the Fire and Police Departments of the City of San Antonio. The particular civil service rules violated by Probationary Officer Bryant and grounds for suspension are as follows:

(12) Violation of an applicable fire or police department rule or special order.

The Rules and Regulations and Procedures of the San Antonio Police Department which Probationary Officer Bryant has violated are as follows:

RULE 3.18 - CITY EQUIPMENT/PROPERTY (C) SAFE OPERATION OF VEHICLES: City vehicles will be operated in a safe manner and in compliance with all traffic laws.

The factual basis for the instant disciplinary suspension is as follows:

On or about October 23, 2017, at approximately 9:20 p.m., while on duty and operating a city-owned vehicle in the 1700 block of W. Huisache Avenue, Probationary Officer Julissa M. Bryant negligently struck a fire hydrant.

The level of this suspension is based upon Probationary Officer Bryant's cumulative point total for this accident and other chargeable accidents within the twenty-four month period prior to this accident as per Procedure 303.16 of the San Antonio Police Department General Manual.

A copy of the instant disciplinary suspension order is being filed with the Fire Fighters' and Police Officers' Civil Service Commission.
