AGREED SUSPENSION

Commissioners and Detective Jose Riojas III:

WHEREAS, Detective Jose Riojas III, pursuant to Article XXVIII, Section 2 of the Collective Bargaining Agreement by and between the City of San Antonio and the San Antonio Police Officers' Association, was served on March 26, 2018, with a one-day contemplated suspension; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to said contract, Detective Riojas was given an opportunity to rebut those charges being brought against him to Police Chief William P. McManus; and

WHEREAS, said opportunity was exercised by Detective Riojas; and

WHEREAS, Detective Riojas and his captain, Randall Smith, have agreed and Chief McManus has approved of settling this matter with a one-day suspension without pay; NOW THEREFORE:

The undersigned parties hereby enter into this suspension agreement wherein it is provided that Detective Riojas shall be suspended without pay from the San Antonio Police Department for a period of one day, commencing on May 3, 2018, and ending on May 3, 2018. Detective Riojas waives any rights to appeal this Agreed Suspension and agrees no administrative or judicial body shall have power to review this Agreed Suspension or alter the terms of this agreement.

Detective Riojas has violated Subsection C of Rule XIII of the City of San Antonio Fire Fighters' and Police Officers' Civil Service Commission Rules, said rules having been adopted on February 23, 1998, and thereafter from time to time amended, by the Fire Fighters' and Police Officers' Civil Service Commission as the Civil Service Rules for the Fire and Police Departments of the City of San Antonio. The particular civil service rules violated by Detective Riojas and grounds for suspension are as follows:

(12) Violation of an applicable fire or police department rule or special order.

The Rules and Regulations and Procedures of the San Antonio Police Department which Detective Riojas has violated are as follows:

RULE 3.04 - RESPONSIBILITY TO SERVE THE PUBLIC (C) CONDUCT AND BEHAVIOR: Members, on-or off-duty, shall be governed by the ordinary and reasonable rules of good conduct and behavior, and shall not commit any act tending to bring reproach or discredit on themselves or the department.
