Under and by virtue of the authority vested in me by Title 5, Subtitle A, Chapter 143 of the Local Government Code, V.T.C.S., said chapter entitled "Municipal Civil Service", I do hereby suspend Probationary Officer Christopher K. Copeland from paid duty with the San Antonio Police Department for a period of one calendar day, commencing on November 15, 2018, and ending on November 15, 2018.

Probationary Officer Copeland has violated Subsection C of Rule XIII of the City of San Antonio Fire Fighters' and Police Officers' Civil Service Commission Rules, said rules having been adopted on February 23, 1998, and thereafter from time to time amended, by the Fire Fighters' and Police Officers' Civil Service Commission as the Civil Service Rules for the Fire and Police Departments of the City of San Antonio. The particular civil service rule violated by Probationary Officer Copeland and ground for suspension is as follows:

(12) Violation of an applicable fire or police department rule or special order.

The Rules and Regulations of the San Antonio Police Department which Probationary Officer Copeland has violated are as follows:

RULE 3.18 - CITY EQUIPMENT/PROPERTY (C) SAFE OPERATION OF VEHICLES: City vehicles will be operated in a safe manner and in compliance with all traffic laws.

The factual basis for the instant disciplinary suspension is as follows:

On or about August 12, 2018, at approximately 11:20 p.m., while on duty and operating a city-owned vehicle at the intersection of Nogalitos Street and W. Theo Avenue, Probationary Officer Christopher K. Copeland negligently collided with a vehicle.

The level of this suspension is based upon Probationary Officer Copeland's cumulative point total for this accident and other chargeable accidents within the twenty-four month period prior to this accident as per Procedure 303.17 of the San Antonio Police Department General Manual.

A copy of the instant disciplinary suspension order is being filed with the Fire Fighters' and Police Officers' Civil Service Commission.
