AGREED SUSPENSION

Commissioners and Officer John J. Mendoza:

WHEREAS, Officer John J. Mendoza, pursuant to Article XXVIII, Section 2 of the Collective Bargaining Agreement by and between the City of San Antonio and the San Antonio Police Officers' Association, was served on October 5, 2018, with a three-day contemplated suspension; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to said contract, Officer Mendoza was given an opportunity to rebut those charges being brought against him to Police Chief William P. McManus; and

WHEREAS, said opportunity was exercised by Officer Mendoza; and

WHEREAS, Officer Mendoza and Chief McManus have agreed that the discipline in this matter shall be a three-day suspension without pay; NOW THEREFORE:

The undersigned parties hereby enter into this suspension agreement wherein it is provided that Officer Mendoza shall be suspended without pay from the San Antonio Police Department for a period of three days, commencing on November 30, 2018, and ending on December 2, 2018. Officer Mendoza waives any rights to appeal this Agreed Suspension and agrees no administrative or judicial body shall have power to review this Agreed Suspension or alter the terms of this agreement.

Officer Mendoza has violated Subsection C of Rule XIII of the City of San Antonio Fire Fighters' and Police Officers' Civil Service Commission Rules, said rules having been adopted on February 23, 1998, and thereafter from time to time amended, by the Fire Fighters' and Police Officers' Civil Service Commission as the Civil Service Rules for the Fire and Police Departments of the City of San Antonio. The particular civil service rules violated by Officer Mendoza and grounds for suspension are as follows:

(12) Violation of an applicable fire or police department rule or special order.

The Rules and Regulations and Procedures of the San Antonio Police Department which Officer Mendoza has violated are as follows:

The system may also be accessed through www.sanantonio.gov, then Telecommuting (at the bottom of the page), then SAPD Off-Duty Work Permits. Forward all permits through the chain-of-command to the Chief of Staff.

The factual basis for the instant disciplinary suspension is as follows:

During an investigation of an Administrative Review of an officer-involved violence incident, it was discovered that Officer John J. Mendoza, #0691 (SPB) had been working at Mama Margie's Mexican Restaurants located at 9950 IH 10 and at 7335 S. Zarzamora at least 28 separate times from January 7, 2018 thru July 25, 2018 without an approved Employment Permit. The Administration alleges Officer Mendoza did not acquire an approved Employment Permit to engage in outside employment at Mama Margie's Mexican Restaurants.

A copy of the instant disciplinary suspension order is being filed with the Fire Fighters' and Police Officers' Civil Service Commission.
