## AGREED SUSPENSION

Commissioners and Officer Joshua A. Vega:

WHEREAS, Officer Joshua A. Vega, pursuant to Article XXVIII, Section 2 of the Collective Bargaining Agreement by and between the City of San Antonio and the San Antonio Police Officers' Association, was served on November 21, 2018, with a contemplated indefinite suspension; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to said contract, Officer Vega was given an opportunity to rebut those charges being brought against him to Police Chief William P. McManus; and

WHEREAS, said opportunity was exercised by Officer Vega; and

WHEREAS, Officer Vega and Chief McManus have agreed to reduce the discipline in this matter to a two-day suspension without pay; NOW THEREFORE:

The undersigned parties hereby enter into this suspension agreement wherein it is provided that Officer Vega shall be suspended without pay from the San Antonio Police Department for a period of two days, commencing on January 8, 2019, and ending on January 9, 2019. Officer Vega waives any rights to appeal this Agreed Suspension and agrees no administrative or judicial body shall have power to review this Agreed Suspension or alter the terms of this agreement.

Officer Vega has violated Subsection C of Rule XIII of the City of San Antonio Fire Fighters' and Police Officers' Civil Service Commission Rules, said rules having been adopted on February 23, 1998, and thereafter from time to time amended, by the Fire Fighters' and Police Officers' Civil Service Commission as the Civil Service Rules for the Fire and Police Departments of the City of San Antonio. The particular civil service rules violated by Officer Vega and grounds for suspension are as follows:

(12) Violation of an applicable fire or police department rule or special order.

The Rules and Regulations and Procedures of the San Antonio Police Department which Officer Vega has violated are as follows:

PROCEDURE 410 – BODY WORN CAMERAS (.06) RECORDING (F) (2) Officers may momentarily mute only: (a) Conversations that involve police and/or case tactics or strategy and; (b) Personal emergency matters of a sensitive nature (i.e. family emergency, medical emergency, catastrophic event).
